Safety Data Sheet Exemption Letter

Dear Valued Customer,

Products used in our First Aid cabinets (OTCs) are exempt from SDS sheets under the same OSHA regulation 1910-1200, Section (b) (6) (vii). This states, "Any drug as defined in the Federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act, when it is in solid form for direct administration to the patient (e. g. tablets or pills); drugs which are packaged by a pharmaceutical manufacturer for sale to consumers in a retail establishment (e. g. over the counter drugs); and drugs intended for personal consumption by employees while in the workplace (e. g first aid supplies).

The exemption eliminates the need for the SDS. Cintas provides Drug Facts information and complete warnings on all of our products which are available on the backs of our boxes and on our Drug Fact Pocket Cards for our customers to review prior to using the product.

OSHA regulation 1910-1200 refers to Hazard Communication and states, "Ensure that all hazards of all chemicals produced or imported are evaluated, and that information concerning their hazards is transmitted to employers and employees. This transmittal of information is to be accomplished by means of comprehensive hazard communication programs which are to include container labeling and other forms of warning, material safety data sheets and employee training.

We recommend that you file this letter with your SDS records for documentation purposes.
