Fleet Memo #22: Waiting for work vs. Layup status

Background:

While the GeoExplorer was in shipyard in November of 2012 an ABS external audit was conducted of the vessel's Safety Management System. One of the findings referred to a logbook entry, "Vessel in Lay-up", during a period when the vessel was inactive.

The word "Lay-up" on a Classed vessel refers to a vessel that has been inactive for more than five (5) months. At this time the owners are required by ABS Rules, Part 7 Rules for Survey After Construction, Section 3 Vessel Lay-up and Reactivation, to notify ABS and the Flag Administration of this status. At this time all certificates are frozen in time until vessel is re-activated.

New Procedure:

From this date forward, if your vessel becomes static due to awaiting work please make entries into the Deck and Engine logbooks daily if possible, minimally monthly that: "Vessel is Inactive, awaiting orders for work to resume." This should also be stated in the Master's handover notes.
